# Summer School For 5th-8th Grade Students

The Apache Junction Unified School District is making their last call for those who wish to take advantage of the special summer school learning opportunity for all current 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grade students this summer.

The special summer school will be held from Monday, June 2 through Thursday, June 26 at

Desert Shadows Middle School (DSMS), 801 W. Southern Avenue. The classes will be held from 8 a.m. until 11 a.m. Monday through Thursday.

Classes are available both for students needing remediation for deficiencies in Reading, English or Math or for those interested in accelerating their math skills. Students successfully completing their math enrichment program may be eligible for a

higher level math course for the 2008-2009 school year.

Those who are interested must register by Tuesday, June 3 with payments no later than Wednesday, June 3. Fees are \$125 and are to be paid with check or cash. There is a \$25 processing fee for anyone withdrawing on or before the second day of class. No refunds permitted after the second day. Some scholarships for DSMS students are available. The cover letter, included with the petitions, insists the Gold Canyon Sewer Company claims "must be in error" and closes with, "We ask the Arizona Corporation Commission to consider verification of their claim."

A second batch of petitions were also reportedly delivered via the United States Postal Service, signature required, and confirmation was reportedly received that they were accepted and signed for. Kelly said he has been assured that the petitions will be viewed by the commissioners.

The commission judge will be reviewing the final briefs, arguments and discussion of documents in the case and will give his opinion to the commissioners. The commissioners will then set a date for a public hearing where their decision will be announced. Kelly said that he has been promised he will be notified of the date by phone call and will inform the media at that time.

Kelly said he is hopeful that the commissioners will take the voice of the citizens into consideration in their decision, saying, "Any action that numbers of people take in unison is rarely ignored or goes to waste."
