



IRS Seeks Residents For Stimulus Checks

Approximately 2,000 Apache Junction residents who qualify for the economic stimulus payment have not filed a tax return to claim it. They are among 5.2 million potential recipients, mainly retirees

and disabled veterans, estimated by the Internal Revenue Service, who have not taken the steps to receive the payment.

People who receive certain benefits from Social Security

and Veterans Affairs are normally not required to file a tax return. However, these individuals must file a return before Oct. 15 this year to receive their economic stimulus payment.

Later this summer, the IRS will be sending a special letter to potential recipients explaining the stimulus payment eligibility and how to claim it. The letter will include a sample tax form and an actual tax form that people can complete and mail to the IRS. This will

be the second special mailing to reach those individuals.

Eligible taxpayers will receive economic stimulus payments between \$300 to \$600 if single or \$600 to \$1,200 if married filing jointly. The payments will not be taxable next year nor will they affect the amount of Social Security or VA benefits received.

Corrections

In the July 7, 2008, issue of *The News*, an article quoting City Councilman Jeff Serdy entitled "Recall Petitions Filed on Five Councilmembers" should have said, "Serdy explained he is trying to remain positive during the recall process."

"We took it for six months while they assaulted us verbally and several of us responded. I would hope that people would not want to elect vicious, hateful people, but people who show more leadership," Serdy said.

"You can see it in their eyes—the hate, the venom and the viciousness. I'm going to try to always be positive in the time that I have. I'm going to keep working for the people."

He said the organizers originally pulled recall petitions because they believed the council did not listen to the public.

"They no longer say that anymore. They go on to corruption. They can't say we don't listen. My wife doesn't even like to go to the store with me. I shop here in Apache Junction. My wife hates it when we go to Wal-Mart. I stay and I listen to every one of them. When I go shopping here locally, people just stop me all the time constantly and my wife hates it, and telephone calls. If they're

electd, they're in for a rude awakening."

Serdy said it would be ironic and troubling if he and the other recall targets were voted out of office.

"If they sweep us out of office, why do they think it would stop there? What's to keep it from going to a Hatfield and McCoy situation? All of our supporters might immediately start recalls on them. This might go on forever. Let's have an election. Let's do our job and stop this before it goes on forever."
