In a meeting earlier in the summer, Hoffman recommended an audit every five years, "regardless of the circumstances of the moment." He said he encouraged this for several reasons including:

- First, public safety is of vital importance to the community.
- Second, it represents the largest allocation of resources by department in the general fund budget.
- Third, the issues the police department deals with are often difficult and represent one of the major challenges for any municipality.

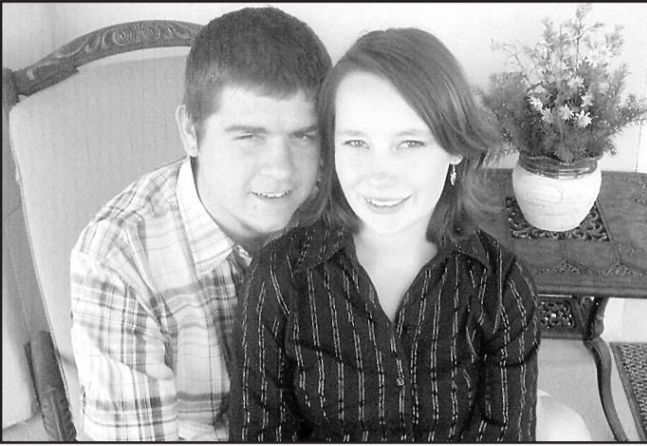
Mystery Hunters characters Araya and Christina are regular kids with inquisitive minds, who travel the globe to investigate sites and delve into tales that have baffled
