Mesa Police Chase Ends in AJ

A 16-mile police chase through Mesa that ended in Apache Junction resulted in the arrest of a transient on Monday, Aug. 11.

Officers were dispatched to a hit and run collision in the 1900 block of East Broadway in Mesa where they saw a vehicle that matched the suspect's car according to a police report.

Officers initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle around 6:45 p.m. and the driver sped up aggressively and attempted

to flee the police. The officers then turned on their overhead emergency lights and sirens in an attempt to persuade the driver to pull over. The driver, later identified as 37-year-old Johnny Lee Wood, ignored the officers and continued to drive erratically to get away.

"The defendant drove his vehicle recklessly, almost causing numerous accidents," the police report reads. "There were several bystanders, pedestrians and children present along various portions of the incident."

Officers continued following the vehicle from a dis-

stance, while continuing with routine driving. Meanwhile, Wood continued to flee, blowing several red lights. Officers from the Department of Public Safety as well as the Apache Junction Police Department became involved, trying to pull over Wood.

Eventually Wood's vehicle collided with a street sign at Delaware and Renaissance in Apache Junction where he was taken into custody.

"Under Miranda, the defendant admitted that he saw all of the police cars and knew that they were all trying to pull him over," the police re-

port reads. "He stated he was fleeing because he was trying to get home and he knew his license was suspended."

Wood is also on probation on charges of shoplifting. He was charged with unlawful flight, hit and run from an accident involving damage and reckless driving.
