for the Prospectors included David Fernando in long jump (18-08), Ole Gabrielson in pole vault (10-00), Chance Van Soest in shot put (42-09), Trevor Berner in discus (150-06), Colt Grandstaff in high jump (5-08), and the 400 meter relay team (44:96) and 1600 meter relay team (3:38.79).

Quiroz leaped 14-01 to win long jump and then leaped 30-04 to take the triple jump top spot, while Woodruff ran 5:58.93 to win the 1600 meters and then ran 12:46.11 to win the 3200 meters for the AJHS girls. Other first place finishes came from Caitlin Kessler in the 800 meters (2:44.07), Keisha McClincy in shot put (31-06), Erin Herbert in high jump (4-04), and the girls 1600 meter relay team (4:47.53).

Second place finishers included Gabrielson in long jump (18-04), Zach Divilbiss in pole vault (9-05), Andrew Duarte in the 300 meter hurdles (46:82), Tyler O'Reilly in shot put (40-09), Kyrel Parker in high jump (5-08) for the AJHS boys, and Lauren Smith in the 400 meters (1:07.19), Sierra Aulik in high jump (4-02) and the 3200 meter relay team (13:01.75) for the AJHS girls.

Coming up with a third place for the boys were Parker in the 100 meters (11:38), Grandstaff in the 200 meters (24:32), Van Soest in discus (119-02), and both the 400 meter relay (47:87) and 3200 meter relay (10:19.17).

Fourth place finishers for AJHS included Fernando in the 100 meters, Roy Machuca in long jump, Ricky Donald in the 400 meters, Parker in the 200 meters, Lyle Wyatt in discus, and Michael Orr in the 3200 meters for the boys, and Herbert in triple jump and in discus, Sarah Swander in shot put and discus, Kylee Heflin in the 3200 meters for the girls.

Coming up with a fifth place finish were Winter Luidhardt in pole vault, Orr in the 400 and 800 meters, Jeff Taylor in shot put, Tan-

ner Morgan in the 200 meters for the AJHS boys, and Al' Lexus White in the 100 meters, McClincy in discus, Bonow in long jump, Carly Reid in the 800 meters, and Taylor Harvey in shot put for the AJHS girls.

The track and field teams also competed this past Saturday in the Greenway Invitational but results were not available at press time.

This week, the AJHS track and field teams will host Phoenix Arcadia and Poston Butte on Wednesday, April 14 and will then head to Pinetop/Lakeside on Friday, April 16 to compete in the Blue Ridge Invitational.
