



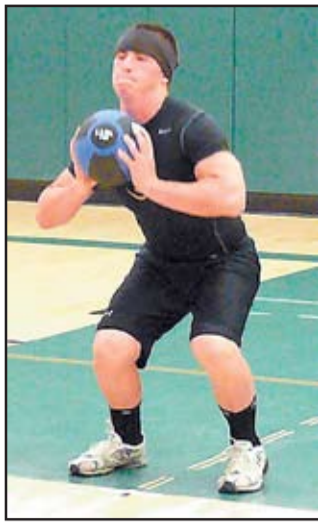

Updating the boys 9-10 District 7 Tournament, the Little Leaguers from Apache Junction dropped their final two games to Mesa Eastern and Red Mountain American and although they went 0-4 overall, lost two of their games by a single run.

The Boys Major All-Stars (11-12) and the Junior All-Stars begin their District 7 tournaments this Thursday, July 1 with the Major All-Stars taking on Mesa Western at 7:30 p.m. at Countryside Park (off of Southern Avenue in Mesa and about one-quarter mile west of Val Vista) and the Junior All-Stars playing against Mesa Western at 6:00 p.m. at Gene Autry Park in Mesa. The Junior All-Stars are also scheduled to play against Red Mountain National on Friday, June 2 at 8:00 p.m. in their final "pool play" game and should they finish first or second in their pool, would play again on Tuesday, July 6 in the championship round.

The winner of the District 7 tournament would then advance to Sectional play in Tucson, although dates were not yet available at www.az7littleleague.org. After sectionals, the winner moves

on to the Arizona state championships with the winner there moving onto regional competition in Aliso Vieja, California. The Junior Baseball Little League World Series is held each year in Taylor, Michigan, and last year, the Junior All-Star team from Scottsdale was crowned World Series champions.

The Major All-Stars have a total of four pool play games. After meeting Mesa Western this Thursday, they are also scheduled to play Mesa Southern on July 6 at 5:30 p.m. against Mesa Eastern on July 7 at 7:30 p.m., and against Red Mountain American on July 8 at 5:30 p.m., all at Countryside Park.

The championship round for the Major All-Stars is scheduled for July 9-10. The winner there moves onto Sectional play to be held in Casa Grande, although dates were not yet available at www.az7littleleague.org. After sectional play, the Arizona state championships would follow and the state winner advances to San Bernardino, California for the Regional Championships, culminating with the Little League World Series held each year in Williamsport, PA, and televised on ESPN.

Leadoff batter Ashley Gonzales went 2-for-2 at the plate, Gonwa had a RBI-producing double, Price singled and scored, Marissa Stinnett had a single and knocked in a run, Sarah Cooper walked and scored, and Saathoff drove in a run on a fielder's choice.

Gonwa had two more put-outs in center field in game two, one a diving catch for an out and Cooper did a solid job at catcher.

The Lady Prospector played last week's doubleheader minus three starting players in Sierra Aulik, Jade Yost and Melissa Ochoa, three potent bats on offense. The three girls were in Oregon with the Lady Prospector basketball team competing in two separate tournaments.

The AJHS girls wrap up their Summer softball this Wednesday, June 30 hosting Mesa Dobson in a twin bill with the first game starting at 8:30 a.m. AJHS is also competing this Summer in the Tempe Summer Prep League at Kiwanis Park and has two teams in the league, made up mostly of up-and-coming AJHS softball players, including incoming freshmen.
